This event will mark the 150th anniversary of the birth of Sir Winston Churchill. This will include a **Gala Dinner** attended by **Randolph Churchill**, Honorary Knight of the Order and the great-grandson of Sir Winston Churchill, and a visit on **Saturday 11th May** by coach to **Chartwell**, the country house in Kent which was Churchill's home for over forty years, including lunch.

The **Gala Dinner on Friday 10th May** will take place at the famous **Buck's Club** - a members' club in Mayfair established in 1919 and mentioned by P. G. Wodehouse in some of his stories. The Club is best known for the Buck's Fizz cocktail which was created there in 1921 by its legendary bartender, McGarry.

There will be a **dinner on the evening of Saturday 11th May** and the programme will conclude on Sunday morning by attending the church service at St. Martin-in-the-Fields Church which will finish at 11.15 am.

We are particularly delighted that the Procurator of our Order, **Baron Vinzenz von Stimpfl-Abele**, will give an impulse statement on the general theme of the year „Courage for Responsibility“ this weekend.

Please kindly note that guests and partners are also welcome but attendance will be limited to a total of 40 people. If more people want to attend we will set up a waiting list.
